Secretary's Report for 1981

1981 was a very successful year for the Society. The average attendance for the four meetings was 44 - a healthy figure compared to a few years ago when we were glad to have 30 for any meeting. The ratio of members to guests was about fifty-fifty which is appropriate for what are usually friendly and sociable occasions.

As you know, we suffered a terrible shock with the sudden death in August of our indefatigable Treasurer, Derek Watkins. His passing was a sad loss to those members who knew him well, particularly to your Secretary who relied on him greatly in the running of the society. The improved fortunes we have enjoyed in recent years is due in no small measure to the efficient organisation he built up.

Several members have suggested that some memorial to Derek be devised and the committee have decided to found a 'Derek Watkins Memorial Trophy' to be played for in 1982. This will be awarded to the member with the best aggregate score over all 4 meetings. The Spicer Trophy, previously awarded for this achievement, will now revert to its original purpose as the award for the best single net score at any meeting. We feel that members would be willing to underwrite the cost of this new trophy and accordingly I am asking every member to contribute a minimum of £1.00 to provide funds to purchase a suitable trophy. Of course, those who knew Derek personally may wish to give a little more and we hope to raise at least £100 in this way to provide a fitting memorial that will be played for in many years to come. Contributions will be collected at Gerrards Cross but, for those unable to come, a donation by cheque (payable to the society) would be much appreciated.

Derek's death meant we needed someone to prepare the Balance Sheet and I am most grateful to our Captain, David Morgan, who stepped into the breach and took over the financial side. Much had to be done including the formalities at the bank, transfer of funds to a local branch, and, of course, the preparation of a balance sheet.

All this has now been completed and, thanks to Derek's meticulous paper work, David reports that our financial affairs are now in order. David has indicated his willingness to accept nomination as Treasurer for 1982 and I know you will join with me in offering our thanks to him for his efforts coming, as they did, during his own commitments as Captain.

He can feel satisfied that during his term of office the Society enjoyed great support. For Roy Osborne, who soon takes over, we trust this peak will be maintained or even exceeded in 1982.

The first three meetings of 1981 have already been chronicled but special mention must be made of Captain's Day. Buckingham, although 'Centrally' situated, does entail a long journey for most of us and as members set out from home before dawn in teeming rain the prospects for golf were dismal. However ten minutes before the scheduled start it ceased and despite threatening skies it kept off until the afternoon event was completed, whereupon the 'heavens' opened again!
