Report for 2008

The Spring Meeting was held at the vice-captain's home club, Wrotham Heath on 25 April. The weather was overcast but dry and the 24 players enjoyed an excellent, varied course with some interesting and precipitous holes. **Alan Wood** won the Jack Ryman Cup with a creditable 40 points. The Annual General Meeting saw David Cox elected as our new captain and he, in turn, nominated Chris Lee as his vice-captain. Both the Treasurer and Secretary were re-elected.

Next followed a return in June to Old Fold Manor after a period of many years. This meeting was sponsored by Gordon Christiansen and Red Box. Again, the weather was overcast and dry but a stiff breeze, coupled with fiendish pin positions (in place for their Club Championship the next day) on the undulating greens made scoring difficult. Nevertheless this did not deter **Alan Wood** who triumphed again, despite a handicap reduction, with 37 points to take The John Bond Cup. The sponsor was very generous with his prizes and 33 players had a good day.

The month of July is synonymous with President's Day at Gerrards Cross - a venue we have played 22 times since our inception and only one less that it's neighbouring club, Denham. Once again our vice-captain sponsored the event on behalf of Office Zone and there was the usual good turn-out of 38. We inherited a breeze from the previous meeting but there were occasional sunny periods. **Chris Lee** emerged the winner of the President's Trophy with 34 points - a feat which gave him great pleasure as it was his first at any Society meeting. The course, as ever, was immaculate and the food well up to the usual very high standard.

The six aggregate trophies for the year have, unusually, been won by only two members. A tribute to both Alan Wood and David Stride for their sheer consistency. Alan took the Liberty, Guildford, Tolley and Spicer Trophies while David won the Watkins and Conlon Trophies. Congratulations to them both.

In summary, a varied programme of meetings much enjoyed by those fortunate enough to attend and our thanks go to David Cox for his excellent choice and great organisation, fully maintaining the high standards that our captains always seem to live up to.
